1 presentation by the retired military veteran of the United
2 States government issued Veteran Identification Card or a
3 DD-214 Proof of Military Service form and sufficient proof
4 that the person is a military retiree. The retired military
5 veteran shall apply for renewal as required by law, but shall
6 be eligible to obtain renewed pistol permits without paying a
7 fee as long as he or she meets the conditions for renewal of
8 the permit.

9 "(c) In the event a retired veteran, to whom a
10 pistol permit has been issued pursuant to subsection (b), is
11 ~~suspected of or is charged with any crime convicted of a~~
12 ~~suspected of or is~~ charged with any crime or convicted of a
13 felony involving moral turpitude, as defined in Section
14 17-3-30.1, domestic violence in the first degree, as defined
15 in Section 13A-6-130, or domestic violence in the second
16 degree, as defined in Section 13A-6-131, then the sheriff of
17 the county in which the retired veteran resides may revoke the
18 pistol permit. The sheriff shall notify the retired veteran in
19 writing and by registered mail that his or her pistol permit
20 is revoked. The sheriff shall state the reasons for the
21 revocation and order the retiree to return his or her pistol
22 permit to that sheriff within 30 days. Should the retired
23 veteran refuse to return the pistol permit within the 30-day
24 limit and continue to carry the handgun, he or she shall be
25 guilty of carrying a weapon without a license or carrying a
26 concealed weapon, whichever might be the case."

1 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
2 first day of the third month following its passage and
3 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
