5	Under existing law, a person may be issued a
6	permit to carry certain firearms.
7	This bill would require a person to have a
8	permit to legally carry an assault weapon in a vehicle
9	or on his or her person.
LO	This bill would require a person to have a
L1	permit to purchase or otherwise acquire an assault
L2	weapon.
L3	This bill would provide exceptions for certain
L 4	entities and circumstances from these requirements.
L 5	This bill would also provide a criminal penalty

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23	Relating to firearms; to require a permit to carry an
24	assault weapon in a vehicle or on one's person; to require a
25	permit to purchase or acquire an assault weapon; to provide

28 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:



- Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the following terms have the following meanings:
- 31 (1) ANTIQUE FIREARM. A firearm or replica of a firearm 32 not designed or redesigned for using rim fire or conventional 33 center fire ignition with fixed ammunition and manufactured in 34 or before 1898, including any matchlock, flintlock, percussion 35 cap, or similar type of ignition system. The term includes any 36 firearm using fixed ammunition manufactured in or before 1898, 37 for which ammunition is no longer manufactured in the United States and is not readily available in the ordinary channels 38
- 40 (2) ASSAULT WEAPON. a. A weapon that is:
- 1. A semiautomatic rifle that has the capacity to
  42 accept a detachable magazine and has one or more of the
  43 following:
- 44 (i) A pistol grip that protrudes conspicuously beneath 45 the action of the weapon.
- 46 (ii) A thumbhole stock.

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- 47 (iii) A folding or telescoping stock.
- 48 (iv) A second handgrip or a protruding grip that can be 49 held by the nontrigger hand.
- 50 (v) A flash suppressor, muzzle break, muzzle
  51 compensator, or threaded barrel designed to accommodate a
  52 flash suppressor, muzzle break, or muzzle compensator.
- (vi) A grenade launcher or flare launcher.
- 2. A semiautomatic pistol that has the capacity to accept a detachable magazine and has one or more of the following:



- 57 (i) Any feature capable of functioning as a protruding 58 grip that can be held by the nontrigger hand.
- (ii) A threaded barrel capable of accepting a flashsuppressor, forward handgrip, or silencer.
- (iii) A shroud attached to the barrel, or that

  partially or completely encircles the barrel, allowing the

  bearer to hold the firearm with the nontrigger hand without

  being burned, but excluding a slide that encloses the barrel.
- 65 (iv) The capacity to accept a detachable magazine at 66 any location outside of the pistol grip.
- 3. A semiautomatic pistol or a semiautomatic centerfire or rimfire rifle with a fixed magazine that has the capacity to accept more than 10 rounds of ammunition.
- 4. A semiautomatic centerfire or rimfire rifle that has an overall length of less than 30 inches.
- 72 5. A semiautomatic shotgun that has all of the following:
- (i) A pistol grip that protrudes conspicuously beneath
  the action of the weapon, thumbhole stock, or vertical
  handgrip.
- 77 (ii) A folding or telescoping stock.
- 78 (iii) The ability to accept a detachable magazine.
- 79 6. A shotgun with a revolving cylinder.
- 7. A conversion kit, part, or combination of parts from which a weapon described in this paragraph may be assembled if those parts are in the possession or under the control of the same person.
- b. The term does not include an antique firearm, any



- 85 firearm that has been made permanently inoperable, or any
- 86 firearm that is manually operated by bolt, pump, lever, or
- 87 slide action.
- 88 (3) CAPACITY TO ACCEPT MORE THAN 10 ROUNDS. Capable of
- 89 accommodating more than 10 rounds of ammunition. The term does
- 90 not include a feeding device that has been permanently altered
- 91 so that it cannot accommodate more than 10 rounds of
- 92 ammunition.
- 93 (4) FIREARM. Has the same meaning as provided in
- 94 Section 13A-8-1, Code of Alabama 1975.
- 95 (5) MAGAZINE. Any ammunition feeding device.
- 96 (6) PISTOL. Has the same meaning as provided in Section
- 97 13A-11-70, Code of Alabama 1975.
- 98 (7) RIFLE. Has the same meaning as provided in Section
- 99 13A-11-62, Code of Alabama 1975.
- 100 (8) SHOTGUN. Has the same meaning as provided in
- 101 Section 13A-11-62, Code of Alabama 1975.
- 102 (b) (1) No person shall knowingly carry an assault
- 103 weapon in a vehicle or on his or her person unless he or she
- 104 possesses a valid assault weapon permit issued in accordance
- 105 with this section.
- 106 (2) No person shall purchase or otherwise acquire an
- 107 assault weapon unless he or she possesses a valid assault
- 108 weapon permit issued in accordance with this section
- 109 (c) A person who acquires an assault weapon by means of
- 110 beguest or intestate succession shall have a grace period of
- 111 90 days from the date of acquisition to apply for an assault
- 112 weapon permit.

# THE SERVICE

- 113 (d) A person may apply to the sheriff of the county in which he or she resides for the issuance or renewal of an 114 115 assault weapon permit. An assault weapon permit shall be 116 issued or renewed at the discretion of the sheriff according 117 to the procedures for issuing and renewing a concealed carry permit as provided in Section 13A-11-75, Code of Alabama 1975. 118 119 The fee for an assault weapon permit, and the distribution of 120 funds collected therefrom, shall be as provided for a 121 concealed carry permit in Section 13A-11-75, Code of Alabama 122 1975.
- 123 (e) A violation of subsection (b) is a Class C felony.
- 124 (f) This section shall not apply to any of the
- 125 following:
- 126 (1) A federal, state, or local law enforcement officer 127 or member of the military or naval forces of this state or of 128 the United States while acting in an official capacity.
- 129 (2) A person who possesses a federal firearm license 130 pursuant to 18 U.S.C § 923.
- 131 (3) A person that is on land under his or her control,
  132 in his or her place of residence, or in his or her fixed place
  133 of business.
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 135 1, 2025.
