4 (b) The City Council of the City of Wetumpka, by
5 ordinance passed by simple majority, may regulate and permit
6 the sale for on-premises consumption only of alcoholic
7 beverages on Sunday after 12:00 p.m. upon the licensed
8 premises of retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control
9 Board of the State of Alabama and of the City of Wetumpka
10 serving the general public and located within the corporate
11 limits of the city. Any licensee granted authority to sell
12 alcoholic beverages on Sunday pursuant to this act shall be
13 required to have all servers of alcoholic beverages complete
14 responsible vendor training in the manner provided by the
15 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

16 Section 2. The City Council of the City of Millbrook
17 and the City Council of the City of Wetumpka, by ordinance,
18 may each respectively authorize the sale and distribution of
19 draft beer by retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage
20 Control Board within the corporate limits of the city each
21 respective city council represents. Notwithstanding the
22 foregoing, keg beer may not be sold for off-premises
23 consumption.

24 Section 3. (a) This act shall apply to the
25 regulation of the sale and distribution of alcoholic beverages
26 in the City of Millbrook and the City of Wetumpka in Elmore
27 County.

1 (b) The provisions of this act are cumulative and
2 supplemental to the present power and authority of the City of
3 Millbrook and the City of Wetumpka, respectively, and are not
4 intended to, nor shall they be interpreted so as to repeal any
5 existing power or authority of the City of Millbrook and the
6 City of Wetumpka now permitted under the general laws of the
7 state, or under any local or special act of the Legislature.

8 Section 4. This act shall become effective
9 immediately following its passage and approval by the
10 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
