9	\$10 BILL.

11	WHEREAS, the United States Treasury has announced
12	that the image of an American woman, whose legacy exhibits
13	America's values and inclusive democracy, will be selected to
14	adorn the new \$10 bill; and
15	WHEREAS, Treasury has invited immediate, limited
16	duration public input to the selection process, via "Tweets"
17	to "#TheNew10," or by submitting nominations to the website
18	"thenew10/share-your-ideas/submit; and has indicated that the
19	new bill will be the first paper currency with a tactile
20	element recognizable by visually impaired persons; and
21	WHEREAS, Helen Keller was born in Tuscumbia,
22	Alabama, on June 27, 1880; and
23	WHEREAS, as a blind and deaf seven-year-old child,
24	Helen Keller became an international celebrity and the first
25	person to escape the double dungeon of darkness and silence to

1	effectively communicate with a world she could not see or
2	hear; and
3	WHEREAS, she was the first such disabled person to
4	graduate from college; the first woman awarded a honorary
5	doctorate degree from Harvard University; and she authored 13
6	books and communicated in three languages; and
7	WHEREAS, Helen Keller became America's Goodwill
8	Ambassador to the World, befriending every United States
9	President during her adult lifetime, as well as world leaders,
10	such as Winston Churchill, Prime Minister Nehru, and Emperor
11	Hirohito, while visiting 37 countries; and
12	WHEREAS, she envisioned, and publicly demanded, that
13	America become a truly inclusive democracy, long before it did
14	so; and she effectively advocated for the rights of women,
15	children, minorities, immigrants, and the disabled; and
16	WHEREAS, by her example and writings, she
17	permanently brought discussion of disabilities into the
18	mainstream, forever increasing the life potential of all
19	disabled persons; and
20	WHEREAS, Helen Keller was awarded the Presidential
21	Medal of Freedom, America's highest civilian honor, and was
22	named by Time Magazine as one of the 100 most important people
23	of the 20th century; and
24	WHEREAS, the world still needs Helen Keller's
25	examples of character and values that continue to reflect

great credit upon her home State of Alabama and on America;

and

WHEREAS, the Helen Keller Foundation for Research and Education was established by her family and distinguished scientists and physicians in Birmingham, Alabama, to save sight, speech and hearing, and to teach character education to children and adults through Helen's example and writings; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we call upon Alabama citizens, and all interested persons and organizations everywhere, to view a summary of Helen Keller's lifetime accomplishments at the Youtube website and to promptly communicate to the U.S. Treasury their support of Helen Keller as the best choice to represent America to the world on the new \$10 bill.
