9	CENTRAL ALABAMA ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE.

11	WHEREAS, January 29, 1939, Ruby Smith was born to
12	James C. Smith and Tiny Lee Smith; Ruby's birth was 11 months
13	before Central Alabama Electric Cooperative (CAEC) energized
14	its first substation and 478 miles of line, as it began
15	service to 810 member-consumers with an initial loan of
16	\$378,000 which was secured from the Rural Electrification
17	Administration; Co-op power lighted the way to a brighter
18	future; and
19	WHEREAS, Ruby and her family were among one of the
20	first families to receive life-changing cooperative electric
21	power in the Chilton County Community of Union Grove from
22	CAEC; no one realized in the late 1930's the tremendous
23	positive impact this infant who was born without electric
24	power would eventually have on the Rural Electric Industry;
25	and
26	WHEREAS, August 1, 1956, Ruby married Eugene Neeley
27	a union which lasted 57 years, and produced a loving family

which consists of one daughter, Gwen; her husband, Gary; two grandchildren, Heath and Heather; five great grandchildren, Gracie, Jacob, Will, Tyler, and Bailee; and

WHEREAS, Ruby and Eugene owned and operated Neeley's Store for almost a decade in the Mineral Springs Community of Chilton County, a small commercial account served by CAEC; and

WHEREAS, Ruby Neeley replaced Mr. A.D. Headley on the CAEC Board of Trustees in August 1979, and on October 28, 2014, after 35 years representing District 9, Ruby retired; she faithfully and competently served the CAEC members in various capacities; she has the second longest tenure of service as a Trustee and served as Secretary/Treasurer for the Board; additionally, she was the second woman to serve and the longest-serving female on the CAEC Board; and

WHEREAS, Ruby Neeley, who saw the services grow from 18,000 meters to the present 42,000, has successfully applied her considerable energy, experience, and knowledge of the power industry proficiently serving the many members of CAEC and providing the members of CAEC with reliable and affordable electric service; supporting the Touchtone Energy brand as well as endorsing the International Electrification Program to provide people in developing countries with access to safe, reliable, and affordable electricity; and

WHEREAS, Ruby Neeley, has earned the friendship and respect of the Trustees, Employees, and Members of CAEC; she also served on PowerSouth's Board of Directors, representing CAEC for 22 years, during which time she served on five

1 committees: Nominating, Member Relations and External Affairs, 2 Marketing and Industrial Development, Engineering and Operations and Finance and Audit; furthermore, she served as 3 PowerSouth's delegate to the Alabama Rural Electric Association; and 5 WHEREAS, we should never forget pioneers like Ms. 6 7 Ruby, who, in the electric movement, believed rural dwellers deserved the same conveniences as those who lived in the 8 cities and fought to bring affordable and reliable electricity 9 10 to rural areas of the great State of Alabama; and 11 WHEREAS, Ruby Neeley's steady attachment to co-op 12 principles, her experience and unselfish willingness to serve 13 will be sorely missed by the members and employees of CAEC, 14 PowerSouth, Alabama Rural Electric Association, and the National Rural Electric Association; now therefore, 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 17 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we join Members, Employees, Officers, and Trustees of Central Alabama Electric 18 Cooperative, Inc., and do hereby express our great 19 20 appreciation to Ruby Neeley for the immeasurable service she 21 rendered and a copy of this resolution shall be provided to

her as a token of our appreciation.
