8	URGING CONGRESS TO TAKE ACTION AGAINST ILLEGAL,
9	UNREPORTED, AND UNREGULATED FISHING IN OUR SOVEREIGN WATERS.

11	WHEREAS, illegal, unreported, and unregulated
12	fishing is a global problem with serious economic,
13	environmental, and security implications; and
14	WHEREAS, illegal fishing accounts for economic
15	losses of up to billions of dollars per year nationally; such
16	activity is largely conducted by foreign fleets at the expense
17	of United States fishermen, coastal communities, and the
18	sustainability of global fish stocks; and
19	WHEREAS, illegal fishing is of consequence in
20	Alabama, where the Gulf Coast waters supply seafood for the
21	American public and support the hospitality industry,
22	tourism-related businesses, and the vibrant recreational and
23	commercial fishing industry; not only does illegal fishing
24	result in economic losses to the Alabama fishing industry and
25	other coastal businesses, but it also is a threat to the
26	sustainability of our fisheries and to the Gulf Coast
27	ecosystem; and

WHEREAS, the United States Coast Guard is to be commended for apprehending and investigating foreign vessels engaged in illegal activity along the United States-Mexico border, often patrolling the Gulf of Mexico in a cat-and-mouse game specifically with Mexican fishermen who are fishing illegally; and

WHEREAS, illegal fishermen in the Gulf of Mexico compete for local fish stock and disregard state and federal laws on catch limits or of marine species, including marine mammals and sea turtles that are indiscriminately killed by the use of illegal long-line netting; some of the illegally caught fish are exported back into the United States flooding the market with cheaper, illegally caught fish; and

WHEREAS, vessels involved with illegal fishing are also associated with other crimes, including drug trafficking, human trafficking, and illegal immigration, and the incursion by these foreign fishing vessels into United States waters constitutes a violation of our sovereignty; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we hereby express our commitment to the elimination of illegal fishing, to the long-term conservation of Alabama marine resources, to the protection of the Alabama Gulf Coast fishing and coastal communities, and we hereby encourage the United States Congress to protect our coastal borders and to take action against illegal, unreported, and unregulated fishing in our sovereign waters.
