1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2013,**  
3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008,**  
4 **2009, 2010, 2011, and 2012**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~One~~  
6 ~~Billion, One Hundred Three Million, Six Thousand Dollars (\$1,103,006,000)~~ One  
7 ~~Billion, One Hundred Eight Million, One Hundred and Eighty Four Thousand~~  
8 ~~Dollars (\$1,108,184,000)~~ One Billion, One Hundred Million, Seven Hundred and  
9 ~~Twenty Seven Thousand Dollars (\$1,100,727,000)~~ One Billion, One Hundred  
10 and Nine Million, One Hundred and Nineteen Thousand Dollars  
11 (\$1,109,119,000), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building,  
12 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and  
13 capital equipment purchases of the State, for acquiring certain real estate in  
14 connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other

23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
24 MARYLAND, That:

25 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
26 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
27 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2013 in the total principal amount of  
28 ~~\$1,103,006,000~~ ~~\$1,108,184,000~~ ~~\$1,100,727,000~~ \$1,109,119,000. This loan shall be  
29 evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds  
30 authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered  
31 in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 of the State Finance and Procurement  
32 Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.

33 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold  
34 as a single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

35 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
36 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
37 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then  
38 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the
