A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2013,**
3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009,**
4 **2010, 2011, and 2012**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of One
6 Billion, One Hundred Three Million, Six Thousand Dollars (\$1,103,006,000), the
7 proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, construction, demolition,
8 planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment
9 purchases of the State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection therewith,
10 and for grants to certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain
11 development and improvement purposes, subject to certain requirements that
12 certain matching funds be provided and expended by certain dates; providing
13 generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan; authorizing the
14 creation of State Debt in certain years to be used for certain purposes;
15 prohibiting the expenditure of certain funds until certain Memoranda of
16 Understanding are developed; prohibiting the expenditure of certain funds until
17 a certain university submits a certain report to the Department of Budget and
18 Management; imposing a certain tax on all assessable property in the State;
19 requiring that certain grantees convey certain easements under certain
20 circumstances to the Maryland Historical Trust; providing that the proceeds of
21 certain loans must be expended or encumbered by a certain date; authorizing
22 certain unexpended appropriations in certain prior capital budgets and bond
23 loans to be expended for other public projects; altering certain requirements for
24 certain programs in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans; providing that
25 the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans
26 be reduced by certain amounts; providing for certain additional information to
27 be detailed about each project in the capital program under certain
28 circumstances; requiring that certain projects be constructed at certain
29 locations; repealing certain requirements for certain appropriations; requiring
30 the Comptroller to make certain transfers, adjustments, and reconciliations;
31 repealing certain Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan Preauthorization

27 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
28 MARYLAND, That:

29 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
30 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
31 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2013 in the total principal amount of
32 \$1,103,006,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of
33 State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works
34 and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 of the State
35 Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.

36 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold
37 as a single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

1 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer
2 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and
3 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then
4 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the
5 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
6 architects' and engineers' fees:

13 declares that it is the public policy of this State to manage State general obligation
14 bond debt in a manner that will maintain Maryland’s AAA bond rating. The General
15 Assembly further declares that legislative oversight, control, and review of all forms of
16 State obligations are essential to maintenance of the State’s existing bond rating and
17 protection of the fiscal integrity of the State.

18 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, before work may
19 commence pursuant to any supplement to any appropriation contained in this Act,
20 satisfactory evidence must be given to the Board of Public Works that the project can
21 be completed with the aggregate of the funds in this Act and previously appropriated
22 for the stated purpose.

23 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

38 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, with the approval of the
39 Department of Budget and Management, any appropriation under the provisions of

1 this Act that is in excess of the amount needed for a project may be credited to the
2 Construction Contingency Fund under § 3–609 of the State Finance and Procurement
3 Article.

4 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if federal funds are
5 available to help accomplish any project identified in this Act, the State agency or
6 institution responsible for the project shall make efforts through proper
7 administrative procedures to obtain these federal funds. Before spending any funds
8 appropriated by this Act, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board
9 of Public Works and state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal
10 funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in
11 this Act and not to expand its scope.

12 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

13 (1) for any appropriation for the planning of a State–owned project provided
14 in this Act, if a program required by § 3–602(d) of the State Finance and Procurement
15 Article has not been submitted, the State agency or institution responsible for the

 27 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
 28 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan Preauthorization Act of 2019 in total principal
 29 amount of \$37,963,000. These loans shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and
 30 delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of
 31 Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8-117 through
 32 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.

33 (2) The bonds to evidence these loans or installments of these loans may be
 34 sold as a single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds

36 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer
