1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Finance and Procurement – Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals –**
3 **Membership**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Maryland State Board of Contract
5 Appeals; requiring the membership of the Appeals Board to reasonably reflect the
6 geographic, racial, ethnic, cultural, and gender diversity of the State; specifying that
7 at least one member of the Appeals Board have expertise concerning certain
8 preferences under the procurement law; requiring that certain members of the
9 Appeals Board be licensed to practice law in this State; and generally relating to the
10 membership of the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – State Finance and Procurement**

19 15–207.

1 (a) The Appeals Board consists of [3] FIVE members appointed by the Governor
2 with the advice and consent of the Senate.

3 (b) (1) Each member of the Appeals Board shall:

4 [(1)] (I) be qualified to serve in a quasi-judicial capacity; and

5 [(2)] (II) have a thorough knowledge of procurement practices and
6 processes.

7 (2) AT LEAST TWO MEMBERS OF THE APPEALS BOARD SHALL BE
8 LICENSED TO PRACTICE LAW IN THIS STATE.

9 (3) AT LEAST ONE MEMBER OF THE APPEALS BOARD SHALL HAVE
10 EXPERTISE IN PROCUREMENT MATTERS CONCERNING MINORITY BUSINESS
11 ENTERPRISES, SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISES, VETERAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESS
12 ENTERPRISES, AND ANY OTHER PROCUREMENT PREFERENCES ESTABLISHED
13 UNDER STATE LAW.

14 (4) THE APPEALS BOARD SHALL REASONABLY REFLECT THE
15 GEOGRAPHIC, RACIAL, ETHNIC, CULTURAL, AND GENDER DIVERSITY OF THE STATE.

16 (c) Before taking office, each appointee to the Appeals Board shall take the oath
17 required by Article I, § 9 of the Maryland Constitution.

18 (d) (1) The term of a member is 5 years.

19 (2) The terms of members are staggered as required by the terms provided
20 for members of the Appeals Board on October 1, 1988.

21 (3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is
22 appointed and qualifies.

23 (4) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the
24 rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

25 (e) The Governor may remove a member of the Appeals Board for cause.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
27 October 1, 2015.
