2 **State Board for the Certification of Residential Child Care Program**
3 **Professionals – Revisions**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the requirements for the designation and appointment of a
5 certain program administrator of a residential child care program under certain
6 circumstances; requiring the chief administrator or other appropriate program
7 authority to forward to the State Board for the Certification of Residential Child Care
8 Program Professionals a certain criminal history records check of a certain individual
9 at a certain time; requiring the ~~State Board for the Certification of Residential Child~~
10 ~~Care Program Professionals~~ to evaluate the moral character of an acting residential
11 child care program administrator; requiring the governing body of a residential child
12 care program to appoint a chief administrator of the program; making certain
13 provisions of law that apply to the owner of a residential child care program apply
14 instead to the chief administrator of the program; providing for the designation of an
15 acting chief administrator under certain circumstances; altering the period of time

 7 services background clearance; requiring the results of the child protective services

 10 protective services background clearance under certain circumstances; altering the

29 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

30 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

32 20–101.

33 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

34 (b) (1) “Agency” means:

35 (i) The Developmental Disabilities Administration in the
 36 Department;

37 (ii) The Department;

38 (iii) The Department of Human Resources;

1 (iv) The Department of Juvenile Services; and

2 (v) The Behavioral Health Administration in the Department.

3 (2) “Agency” includes the State Superintendent of Schools.

4 (c) “Board” means the State Board for Certification of Residential Child Care
5 Program Professionals.

6 **(D) “CENTRAL REPOSITORY” MEANS THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE**
7 **INFORMATION SYSTEM CENTRAL REPOSITORY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC**
8 **SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES.**

9 **[(d)] (E)** “Certificate” means, unless the context requires otherwise, a certificate
10 issued by the Board to practice as a program administrator or as a residential child and
11 youth care practitioner.

12 **[(e)] (F)** “Certified program administrator” means, unless the context requires
13 otherwise, an individual who is certified by the Board to practice as a program
14 administrator.

15 **[(f)] (G)** “Certified residential child and youth care practitioner” means, unless
16 the context requires otherwise, an individual who is certified by the Board to practice as a
17 residential child and youth care practitioner.

18 **(H) “CHIEF ADMINISTRATOR” MEANS THE INDIVIDUAL, REGARDLESS OF**
19 **TITLE, WHO IS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF A RESIDENTIAL CHILD CARE**
20 **PROGRAM AS HAVING RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE OVERALL ADMINISTRATION OF THE**
21 **PROGRAM.**

22 **(I) “CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES BACKGROUND CLEARANCE” MEANS A**
23 **SEARCH BY A LOCAL DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES OF A CENTRAL REGISTRY**
24 **ESTABLISHED UNDER TITLE 5, SUBTITLE 7 OF THE FAMILY LAW ARTICLE FOR**
25 **INFORMATION ABOUT CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT INVESTIGATIONS RELATING TO**
26 **AN INDIVIDUAL.**

27 **[(g)] (J)** “Program administrator” means the individual responsible for the
28 day-to-day management and operation of a residential child care program and for assuring
29 the care, treatment, safety, and protection of the children in the residential child care
30 program.

31 **[(h)] (K)** (1) “Residential child and youth care practitioner” means an
32 individual assigned to perform direct responsibilities related to activities of daily living,

1 self-help, and socialization skills in a residential child care program under the direction of
2 a certified program administrator.

3 (2) “Residential child and youth care practitioner” does not include an
4 individual assigned to perform direct responsibilities related to activities of daily living,
5 self-help, and socialization skills in a residential child care program licensed by the
6 Developmental Disabilities Administration.

7 **[(i)] (L)** (1) “Residential child care program” means an entity that provides
8 for children 24-hour per day care within a structured set of services and activities that are
9 designed to achieve specific objectives relative to the needs of the children served and that
10 include the provision of food, clothing, shelter, education, social services, health, mental
11 health, recreation, or any combination of these services and activities.

12 (2) “Residential child care program” includes a program:

13 (i) Licensed by:

- 14 1. The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene;
- 15 2. The Department of Human Resources; or
- 16 3. The Department of Juvenile Services; and

17 (ii) That is subject to the licensing regulations of the Governor’s
18 Office for Children governing the operations of residential child care programs.

20 (a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, [on or after October 1,
21 2007,] an individual shall receive a certificate from the Board before the individual may be
22 a program administrator in this State.

23 (2) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, if a
24 program administrator leaves or is removed from a position as program administrator by
25 death or for any other unexpected cause, the [owner] **CHIEF ADMINISTRATOR** of a
26 residential child care program or other appropriate program authority shall immediately
27 designate a certified program administrator to serve in that capacity.

28 (ii) 1. In the event a certified program administrator is not
29 available, the [owner] **CHIEF ADMINISTRATOR** or other appropriate program authority
30 may appoint a noncertified person to serve in the capacity of acting program administrator
31 for a period not to exceed ~~180~~ **60 90** days.

32 2. The [owner] **CHIEF ADMINISTRATOR** or other
33 appropriate program authority shall immediately notify the Board of the appointment and

1 forward the credentials **AND THE STATE AND NATIONAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS**
2 **CHECK** of the person appointed to the Board for evaluation to assure that the person
3 appointed is experienced, trained, **OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER**, and competent.

4 3. The ~~180-day~~ **60-DAY** **90-DAY** period begins on the date
5 that the program administrator leaves or is removed from the position as a program
6 administrator.

7 4. The Board may extend the ~~180-day~~ **60-DAY** **90-DAY**
8 period for a further period of not more than 30 days.

9 (b) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, on or before
10 October 1, 2015, an individual shall receive a certificate from the Board before the
11 individual may be a residential child and youth care practitioner in this State.

12 (2) This subsection does not apply to:

13 (i) An employee of the Maryland School for the Blind who is a
14 residential child and youth care practitioner and holds a current paraprofessional
15 certificate; or

16 (ii) For up to 180 days, an individual participating in a
17 Board-approved training program.

18 **(C) (1) THE GOVERNING BODY OF EACH RESIDENTIAL CHILD CARE**
19 **PROGRAM SHALL APPOINT A CHIEF ADMINISTRATOR OF THE PROGRAM.**

20 **(2) IF THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATOR OF A RESIDENTIAL CHILD CARE**
21 **PROGRAM LEAVES OR IS REMOVED FROM A POSITION AS CHIEF ADMINISTRATOR BY**
22 **DEATH OR FOR ANY OTHER UNEXPECTED CAUSE, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE**
23 **RESIDENTIAL CHILD CARE PROGRAM SHALL IMMEDIATELY DESIGNATE AN**
24 **INDIVIDUAL TO SERVE AS THE ACTING CHIEF ADMINISTRATOR FOR A PERIOD NOT**
25 **TO EXCEED 180 DAYS.**

27 (a) To qualify for a certificate as a program administrator, an applicant shall be
28 an individual who meets the requirements of this section.

29 (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.

30 (c) The applicant shall have completed [a]:

31 **(1) A State and national criminal history records check; AND**

1 **(2) UNLESS WAIVED BY THE BOARD UNDER § 20-303(D) OF THIS**
2 **SUBTITLE, A CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES BACKGROUND CLEARANCE.**

3 (d) The applicant shall be at least 21 years old.

4 (e) The applicant shall have:

5 (1) (i) A bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university; and

6 (ii) At least 4 years experience in the human service field with at
7 least 3 years in a supervisory or administrative capacity; or

8 (2) (i) A master's degree from an accredited college or university; and

9 (ii) At least 2 years experience in the human service field with at
10 least 1 year in a supervisory or administrative capacity.

11 (f) Except as otherwise provided in this title, the applicant shall pass an
12 examination given by the Board under this subtitle.

13 20-302.1.

14 (a) To qualify for a certificate as a residential child and youth care practitioner,
15 an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.

16 (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.

17 (c) The applicant shall have completed [a]:

18 **(1) A State and national criminal history records check; AND**

19 **(2) UNLESS WAIVED BY THE BOARD UNDER § 20-303(D) OF THIS**
20 **SUBTITLE, A CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES BACKGROUND CLEARANCE.**

21 (d) The applicant shall be:

22 (1) At least 21 years old; or

23 (2) At least 18 years old and have earned at least an associate's or
24 bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university.

25 (e) The applicant shall have:

26 (1) A high school diploma or equivalent and have successfully completed
27 an approved training program; **AND**

1 (2) **(I)** At least 2 years experience in the human service field [and
2 sponsorship from a certified program administrator]; or

3 **[(3)] (II)** An associate's or bachelor's degree from an accredited college or
4 university.

5 (f) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the applicant
6 shall have successfully completed a training program approved under § 20–302.2 of this
7 subtitle.

8 (2) (i) An applicant who has an associate's or bachelor's degree from an
9 accredited college or university may be waived from the training program requirement, if
10 the applicant passes an examination and meets other requirements established by the
11 Board under this subtitle.

12 (ii) The Board shall establish requirements and procedures for
13 waiving the training program requirement for an applicant under subparagraph (i) of this
14 paragraph.

15 (g) The applicant shall pass an examination given by the Board under this
16 subtitle.

17 (h) The Board shall waive the education, experience, training, and examination
18 requirements of this section for an applicant who:

19 (1) Applies for certification on or before October 1, 2015; and

20 (2) Presents to the Board satisfactory evidence that the applicant worked
21 as a residential child and youth care practitioner in the State for at least 2 years before
22 October 1, 2015.

24 (a) To apply for a certificate, an applicant shall:

25 (1) Submit an application to the Board on the form that the Board requires;

26 **(2) PROVIDE EVIDENCE OF APPLICATION FOR A CHILD PROTECTIVE**
27 **SERVICES BACKGROUND CLEARANCE;**

28 **[(2)] (3)** Pay to the Board the application fee set by the Board; and

29 **[(3)] (4)** [Provide fingerprints for use by the Criminal Justice Information
30 System Central Repository of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services to
31 conduct] **APPLY TO THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY FOR** a State and national criminal
32 history records check.

1 **[(b) (1) An applicant required to provide fingerprints under subsection (a)(3) of**
2 **this section shall pay any processing or other fees required by the Criminal Justice**
3 **Information System Central Repository of the Department of Public Safety and**
4 **Correctional Services.**

5 **(2) The results of the criminal history records check shall be provided to**
6 **the Board and the applicant.]**

7 **(B) (1) AS PART OF THE APPLICATION FOR A CRIMINAL HISTORY**
8 **RECORDS CHECK, THE APPLICANT SHALL SUBMIT TO THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY:**

9 **(I) A LEGIBLE SET OF FINGERPRINTS TAKEN IN A FORMAT**
10 **APPROVED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY AND THE DIRECTOR**
11 **OF THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION;**

12 **(II) THE FEE AUTHORIZED UNDER § 10-221(B)(7) OF THE**
13 **CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE FOR ACCESS TO STATE CRIMINAL HISTORY**
14 **RECORDS; AND**

15 **(III) THE PROCESSING FEE REQUIRED BY THE FEDERAL**
16 **BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION FOR A NATIONAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK.**

17 **(2) IN ACCORDANCE WITH §§ 10-201 THROUGH 10-228 OF THE**
18 **CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE, THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY SHALL FORWARD TO**
19 **THE APPLICANT AND THE BOARD THE APPLICANT'S CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS**
20 **INFORMATION.**

21 **(3) INFORMATION OBTAINED FROM THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY**
22 **UNDER THIS SUBSECTION:**

23 **(I) IS CONFIDENTIAL AND MAY NOT BE REDISSEMINATED; AND**

24 **(II) MAY BE USED ONLY FOR THE CERTIFICATION PURPOSE**
25 **AUTHORIZED BY THIS SUBTITLE.**

26 **(4) THE SUBJECT OF A CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK UNDER**
27 **THIS SUBSECTION MAY CONTEST THE CONTENTS OF THE PRINTED STATEMENT**
28 **ISSUED BY THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY AS PROVIDED IN § 10-223 OF THE CRIMINAL**
29 **PROCEDURE ARTICLE.**

30 **(C) THE RESULTS OF THE CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES BACKGROUND**
31 **CLEARANCE SHALL BE PROVIDED TO THE BOARD AND THE APPLICANT.**

1 (D) THE BOARD MAY, AT ITS DISCRETION, WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT IN
2 SUBSECTION (A)(2) OF THIS SECTION ~~IF THE APPLICANT FOR AN OUT-OF-STATE~~
3 APPLICANT WHO PRESENTS EVIDENCE TO THE BOARD THAT CIRCUMSTANCES
4 OUTSIDE THE APPLICANT'S CONTROL PREVENT THE APPLICANT FROM OBTAINING,
5 FROM THE APPLICANT'S STATE OF RESIDENCE, A BACKGROUND CLEARANCE THAT
6 IS EQUIVALENT TO A CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES BACKGROUND CLEARANCE ~~IN A~~
7 ~~TIMELY MANNER.~~

8 20-304.

9 (a) The Board shall keep a file of each certificate application made under this
10 subtitle.

11 (b) The file shall contain:

12 (1) The name, **RESIDENT** address, **EMPLOYMENT ADDRESS**, and age of
13 the applicant;

14 (2) The date of the application;

15 (3) Complete and current information on the educational, training, and
16 experience qualifications of the applicant;

17 (4) The date the Board reviewed and acted on the application;

18 (5) The action taken by the Board on the application;

19 (6) The identifying numbers of any certificate or renewal certificate issued
20 to the applicant; and

21 (7) Any other information that the Board considers necessary.

22 (c) The application files shall be open to public inspection.

23 20-306.

24 (a) Subject to the provisions of this section, the Board may waive any examination
25 requirement of this title for an individual who is certified as a program administrator in
26 any other state that the Board determines has a comparable certification process to the one
27 established in this title.

28 (b) The Board may grant a waiver under this section only if the applicant:

29 (1) Is of good moral character;

1 (2) Pays the application fee required by the Board under § 20–303 of this
2 subtitle; and

3 (3) Provides adequate evidence that:

4 (i) At the time the applicant was certified in the other state, the
5 applicant was qualified to take the examination that then was required by the laws of this
6 State;

7 (ii) The applicant qualified for a certificate in the other state by
8 passing an examination given in that or any other state; and

9 (iii) The applicant has completed a State **AND NATIONAL** criminal
10 history records check.

11 [(c) The Board shall waive the requirements for certification as a certified program
12 administrator under § 20–302 of this subtitle for any person who:

13 (1) Has filed a letter of intent with the Board by October 1, 2007;

14 (2) Has completed not less than 8 years' experience in the human service
15 field with at least 4 years in a supervisory or administrative capacity; and

16 (3) Has by October 1, 2007, successfully passed an examination approved
17 by the Board.]

18 20–307.

19 (a) The Board shall issue a certificate to any applicant who meets the
20 requirements of this title.

21 (b) The Board shall include on each certificate that the Board issues:

22 (1) The full name of the certificate holder; **AND**

23 (2) A serial number[; and

24 (3) The seal of the Board].

25 (c) The Board may issue a certificate to replace a lost, destroyed, or mutilated
26 certificate if the certificate holder pays the certificate replacement fee set by the Board.

27 **(D) AN APPLICANT TO WHOM THE BOARD HAS ISSUED A CERTIFICATE**
28 **UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL MAINTAIN ON FILE WITH THE BOARD THE APPLICANT'S**
29 **CURRENT RESIDENT ADDRESS AND EMPLOYMENT ADDRESS AND UPDATE THE**
30 **INFORMATION WHENEVER CHANGES IN RESIDENCY OR EMPLOYMENT OCCUR.**

2 (a) (1) A certificate expires on a date set by the Board, unless the certificate is
3 renewed for an additional term as provided in this section.

4 (2) A certificate may not be renewed for a term longer than 2 years.

5 (b) At least 1 month before the certificate expires, the Board shall send to the
6 certified program administrator or certified residential child and youth care practitioner,
7 by electronic means or first–class mail to the last known electronic or physical address of
8 the certified program administrator or certified residential child and youth care
9 practitioner, a renewal notice that states:

10 (1) The date on which the current certificate expires;

11 (2) The date by which the renewal application must be received by the
12 Board for the renewal to be issued and mailed before the certificate expires; and

13 (3) The amount of the renewal fee.

14 (c) Before the certificate expires, the certified program administrator or certified
15 residential child and youth care practitioner periodically may renew it for an additional
16 2–year term, if the certified program administrator or certified residential child and youth
17 care practitioner:

18 (1) Otherwise is entitled to obtain a certificate;

19 (2) Pays to the Board a renewal fee set by the Board; and

20 (3) Submits to the Board:

21 (i) A renewal application on the form that the Board requires; [and]

22 (ii) Satisfactory evidence of compliance with any continuing
23 education and other qualifications and requirements set under this section for certificate
24 renewal;

25 **(III) EVIDENCE OF APPLICATION FOR A CHILD PROTECTIVE**
26 **SERVICES BACKGROUND CLEARANCE; AND**

27 **(IV) FINGERPRINTS FOR USE BY THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE**
28 **INFORMATION SYSTEM CENTRAL REPOSITORY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC**
29 **SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES TO CONDUCT A STATE AND NATIONAL**

1 (d) In addition to any other qualifications and requirements established in
 2 consultation with the Children's Cabinet, the Board may set continuing education
 3 requirements as a condition for the renewal of certificates under this section.

4 (e) The Board shall renew the certificate of each certified program administrator
 5 or certified residential child and youth care practitioner who meets the requirements of this
 6 section.

7 **(F) THE BOARD MAY, AT ITS DISCRETION, WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT IN**
 8 **SUBSECTION (C)(3)(III) OF THIS SECTION ~~IF THE APPLICANT FOR AN OUT-OF-STATE~~**

 16 **ARRESTS OR INVESTIGATIONS THAT WOULD APPEAR ON A CHILD PROTECTIVE**
 17 **SERVICES BACKGROUND CLEARANCE AND THAT OCCUR DURING THE PERIOD**
 18 **BETWEEN ISSUANCE OF THE CLEARANCE AND RENEWAL OF THE CERTIFICATE.**

19 20-311.

20 (a) The Board shall reinstate the certificate of a program administrator or
 21 residential child and youth care practitioner who has failed to renew the certificate for any
 22 reason, if the individual:

23 (1) Has not had the certificate suspended or revoked;

24 (2) Meets the renewal requirements of § 20-310 of this subtitle;

25 (3) Pays to the Board the reinstatement fee set by the Board;

26 (4) Submits to the Board satisfactory evidence of compliance with the
 27 qualifications and requirements established under this title for certificate reinstatements;
 28 [and]

29 **(5) PROVIDES FINGERPRINTS FOR USE BY THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE**
 30 **INFORMATION SYSTEM CENTRAL REPOSITORY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC**
 31 **SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES TO CONDUCT A STATE AND NATIONAL**
 32 **CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK;**

33 **(6) PROVIDES EVIDENCE OF APPLICATION FOR A CHILD PROTECTIVE**
 34 **SERVICES BACKGROUND CLEARANCE; AND**

1 **[(5)] (7)** Applies to the Board for reinstatement of the certificate within 5
2 years after the certificate expires.

3 (b) (1) The Board may not reinstate the certificate of a program administrator
4 or residential child and youth care practitioner who fails to apply for reinstatement of the
5 certificate within 5 years after the certificate expires.

6 (2) However, the program administrator or residential child and youth care
7 practitioner may be certified by meeting the current requirements for obtaining a new
8 certificate under this title.

9 **(C) THE BOARD MAY, AT ITS DISCRETION, WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT IN**
10 **SUBSECTION (A)(6) OF THIS SECTION ~~IF THE APPLICANT~~ FOR AN OUT-OF-STATE**

17 (a) The Board shall investigate and take appropriate action as to any complaint
18 filed with the Board that alleges that a certified program administrator or certified
19 residential child and youth care practitioner has failed to meet any standard of the Board.

20 (b) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 20–314 of this subtitle, the Board may
21 deny a certificate to any applicant, reprimand any certified program administrator or
22 certified residential child and youth care practitioner, place any certified program
23 administrator or certified residential child and youth care practitioner on probation, or
24 suspend or revoke a certificate if the applicant, certified program administrator, or certified
25 residential child and youth care practitioner:

26 (1) Fraudulently or deceptively obtains or attempts to obtain a certificate
27 for a program administrator or residential child and youth care practitioner, or for another;

28 (2) Fraudulently or deceptively uses a certificate;

29 (3) Otherwise fails to meet substantially the standards for certification
30 adopted by the Board under § 20–205 of this title;

31 (4) Is convicted of or pleads guilty or nolo contendere to a felony or to a
32 crime involving moral turpitude, whether or not any appeal or other proceeding is pending
33 to have the conviction or plea set aside;

1 (5) Performs the duties of a program administrator or residential child and
2 youth care practitioner while:

3 (i) Under the influence of alcohol; or

4 (ii) Using any narcotic or controlled dangerous substance, as defined
5 in § 5–101 of the Criminal Law Article, or other drug that is in excess of therapeutic
6 amounts or without valid medical indication;

7 (6) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority of any other state
8 or country or convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country for an act that would
9 be grounds for disciplinary action under the Board’s disciplinary statutes;

10 (7) Performs the duties of a program administrator or residential child and
11 youth care practitioner with an unauthorized person or supervises or aids an unauthorized
12 person in performing the duties of a program administrator or residential child and youth
13 care practitioner;

14 (8) Willfully makes or files a false report or record while performing the
15 duties of a program administrator or residential child and youth care practitioner;

16 (9) Willfully fails to file or record any report as required under law,
17 willfully impedes or obstructs the filing or recording of the report, or induces another to fail
18 to file or record the report;

19 (10) Commits an act of unprofessional conduct in performing the duties of a
20 program administrator or residential child and youth care practitioner; [or]

21 (11) Refuses, withholds from, denies, or discriminates against an individual
22 with regard to the provision of professional services for which the individual is certified and
23 qualified to render because the individual is HIV positive; **OR**

24 **(12) FAILS TO MAINTAIN ON FILE WITH THE BOARD A CURRENT**
25 **RESIDENT ADDRESS AND EMPLOYMENT ADDRESS OR NOTIFY THE BOARD WHEN THE**
26 **RESIDENCY OR PLACE OF EMPLOYMENT CHANGES.**
