- 2 (c) A person who applies for a renewal of a permit is not required to be 3 fingerprinted unless the Secretary requires a set of the person's fingerprints to resolve a question of the person's identity.
- 5 (d) The Secretary may establish an alternative expiration date for a permit to 6 coincide with the expiration of a license, certification, or commission for:
- 7 (1) a private detective under Title 13 of the Business Occupations and 8 Professions Article;
- 9 (2) a security guard under Title 19 of the Business Occupations and 10 Professions Article; or
- 11 (3) a special police officer under § 3–306 of this article.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
