FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of the Attorney General to study and compile information regarding certain matters that relate to certain firearms used in the

commission of certain crimes; requiring the Maryland State Police to provide certain information for the study; requiring the Office of the Attorney General to report its

findings to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date;

defining a certain term; and generally relating to crime firearms.
