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
Criminal Law - Weapon Crimes - Switch/Auto-Sear

- FOR the purpose of authorizing a law enforcement unit to seize as contraband and dispose of a certain switch/auto—sear in a certain manner; prohibiting a person from transporting a switch/auto—sear into the State or manufacturing, possessing, selling, offering to sell, transferring, purchasing, or receiving a switch/auto—sear; applying certain penalties to a person who uses a switch/auto—sear in the commission of a felony or a certain crime of violence; and generally relating to weapon crimes.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 Article – Criminal Law

- 23 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 24 (b) "Assault long gun" means any assault weapon listed under § 5–101(r)(2) of the





24 (e) "Binary trigger system" means a device that, when installed in or attached to 25 a firearm, fires both when the trigger is pulled and on release of the trigger.

- 1 "Bump stock" means a device that, when installed in or attached to a firearm, 2 increases the rate of fire of the firearm by using energy from the recoil of the firearm to 3 generate a reciprocating action that facilitates repeated activation of the trigger. "Burst trigger system" means a device that, when installed in or attached to a 4 (g) firearm, allows the firearm to discharge two or more shots with a single pull of the trigger 5 by altering the trigger reset. 6 7 (h) "Copycat weapon" means: (1) 8 a semiautomatic centerfire rifle that can accept a detachable (i) 9 magazine and has any two of the following: 10 1. a folding stock; 2. a grenade launcher or flare launcher; or 11 123. a flash suppressor; 13 (ii) a semiautomatic centerfire rifle that has a fixed magazine with the capacity to accept more than 10 rounds; 14 15 (iii) a semiautomatic centerfire rifle that has an overall length of less than 29 inches; 16 17 a semiautomatic pistol with a fixed magazine that can accept (iv) 18 more than 10 rounds; 19 a semiautomatic shotgun that has a folding stock; or (v) 20(vi) a shotgun with a revolving cylinder. 21(2)"Copycat weapon" does not include an assault long gun or an assault 22pistol. 23 "Detachable magazine" means an ammunition feeding device that can be 24removed readily from a firearm without requiring disassembly of the firearm action or without the use of a tool, including a bullet or cartridge. 25
- 26 (j) "Flash suppressor" means a device that functions, or is intended to function, 27 to perceptibly reduce or redirect muzzle flash from the shooter's field of vision.
- 28 (k) "Hellfire trigger" means a device that, when installed in or attached to a 29 firearm, disengages the trigger return spring when the trigger is pulled.
- 30 (l) "Licensed firearms dealer" means a person who holds a dealer's license under 31 Title 5, Subtitle 1 of the Public Safety Article.

- 1 (m) (1) "Rapid fire trigger activator" means any device, including a removable 2 manual or power-driven activating device, constructed so that, when installed in or 3 attached to a firearm:
- 4 (i) the rate at which the trigger is activated increases; or
- 5 (ii) the rate of fire increases.
- 6 (2) "Rapid fire trigger activator" includes a bump stock, trigger crank, 7 hellfire trigger, binary trigger system, burst trigger system, or a copy or a similar device, 8 regardless of the producer or manufacturer.
- 9 (3) "Rapid fire trigger activator" does not include a semiautomatic 10 replacement trigger that improves the performance and functionality over the stock trigger.
- 11 (N) "SWITCH/AUTO-SEAR" MEANS A DEVICE THAT IS DESIGNED AND
 12 INTENDED FOR USE IN CONVERTING A FIREARM INTO A WEAPON THAT SHOOTS, IS
 13 DESIGNED TO SHOOT, OR CAN BE READILY RESTORED TO SHOOT AUTOMATICALLY
 14 MORE THAN ONE SHOT, WITHOUT MANUAL RELOADING, BY A SINGLE FUNCTION OF
 15 THE TRIGGER.
- [(n)] (O) "Trigger crank" means a device that, when installed in or attached to a firearm, repeatedly activates the trigger of the firearm through the use of a crank, a lever, or any other part that is turned in a circular motion.

- A law enforcement unit may seize as contraband and dispose of according to regulation an assault weapon **OR A SWITCH/AUTO-SEAR** transported, sold, transferred, purchased, received, or possessed in violation of this subtitle.

- 24 A PERSON MAY NOT:
- 25 (1) TRANSPORT A SWITCH/AUTO-SEAR INTO THE STATE; OR
- 26 (2) MANUFACTURE, POSSESS, SELL, OFFER TO SELL, TRANSFER, 27 PURCHASE, OR RECEIVE A SWITCH/AUTO—SEAR.

- 29 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, a person who violates this 30 subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not 31 exceeding 3 years or a fine not exceeding \$5,000 or both.

- 1 (b) (1) A person who uses an assault weapon, a rapid fire trigger activator, A SWITCH/AUTO-SEAR, or a magazine that has a capacity of more than 10 rounds of ammunition, in the commission of a felony or a crime of violence as defined in § 5–101 of the Public Safety Article is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction, in addition to any other sentence imposed for the felony or crime of violence, shall be sentenced under this subsection.
- 7 (2) (i) For a first violation, the person shall be sentenced to 8 imprisonment for not less than 5 years and not exceeding 20 years.
- 9 (ii) The court may not impose less than the minimum sentence of 5 10 years.
- 11 (iii) The mandatory minimum sentence of 5 years may not be 12 suspended.
- 13 (iv) Except as otherwise provided in § 4–305 of the Correctional Services Article, the person is not eligible for parole in less than 5 years.
- 15 (3) (i) For each subsequent violation, the person shall be sentenced to imprisonment for not less than 10 years and not exceeding 20 years.
- 17 (ii) The court may not impose less than the minimum sentence of 10 18 years.
- 19 (iii) A sentence imposed under this paragraph shall be consecutive to 20 and not concurrent with any other sentence imposed for the felony or crime of violence.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2024.
