1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 624.7141, is amended to read:
1.7	624.7141 TRANSFER TO INELIGIBLE PERSON.
1.8	Subdivision 1. Transfer prohibited. A person is guilty of a gross misdemeanor who
1.9	felony and may be sentenced to imprisonment for up to two years and to payment of a fine
1.10	of not more than \$10,000 if the person intentionally transfers a pistol or semiautomatic
1.11	military-style assault weapon to another if and the person knows that the transferee:
1.12	(1) has been denied a permit to carry under section 624.714 because the transferee is
1.13	not eligible under section 624.713 to possess a pistol or semiautomatic military-style assault
1.14	weapon;
1.15	(2) has been found ineligible to possess a pistol or semiautomatic military-style assault
