1.1 A bill for an act

1.2 relating to public safety; increasing penalties for transferring certain firearms to

1.3 persons who are ineligible to possess firearms; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022,

1.4 section 624.7141.

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 624.7141, is amended to read:

1.7 **624.7141 TRANSFER TO INELIGIBLE PERSON.**

1.8 Subdivision 1. **Transfer prohibited.** A person is guilty of a ~~gross misdemeanor who~~

1.9 felony and may be sentenced to imprisonment for up to two years and to payment of a fine

1.10 of not more than \$10,000 if the person intentionally transfers a pistol or semiautomatic

1.11 military-style assault weapon to another if and the person knows that the transferee:

1.12 (1) has been denied a permit to carry under section 624.714 because the transferee is

1.13 not eligible under section 624.713 to possess a pistol or semiautomatic military-style assault

1.14 weapon;

1.15 (2) has been found ineligible to possess a pistol or semiautomatic military-style assault

1.16 weapon by a chief of police or sheriff as a result of an application for a transferee permit

1.17 or a transfer report; or

1.18 (3) is disqualified under section 624.713 from possessing a pistol or semiautomatic

1.19 military-style assault weapon.

1.20 Subd. 2. ~~Felony Aggravated offense.~~ A violation of this section is a felony person who

1.21 violates this section may be sentenced to imprisonment for up to seven years and to payment

2.1 of a fine of not more than \$20,000 if the transferee possesses or uses the weapon within one  
2.2 year after the transfer in furtherance of a felony crime of violence.

2.3 Subd. 3. **Subsequent eligibility.** This section is not applicable to a transfer to a person  
2.4 who became eligible to possess a pistol or semiautomatic military-style assault weapon  
2.5 under section 624.713 after the transfer occurred but before the transferee used or possessed  
2.6 the weapon in furtherance of any crime.
