AN ACT

To repeal sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to absentee voting, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, RSMo, are repealed and three new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, to read as follows:

115.277. 1. Except as provided in subsections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of this section, any registered voter of this state may vote by absentee ballot for all candidates and issues for which such voter [would be] is eligible to vote at the polling place [if such voter expects to be prevented from going to the polls to vote on election day due to:

5 (1) Absence on election day from the jurisdiction of the election authority in which such 6 voter is registered to vote;

7 (2) Incapacity or confinement due to illness or physical disability, including a person 8 who is primarily responsible for the physical care of a person who is incapacitated or confined 9 due to illness or disability;

10 (3) Religious belief or practice;

(4) Employment as an election authority, as a member of an election authority, or by anelection authority at a location other than such voter's polling place;

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(5) Incarceration, provided all qualifications for voting are retained].

2. Any person in federal service[, as defined in section 115.275,] who is eligible to register and vote in this state but is not registered may vote only in the election of presidential and vice presidential electors, United States senator and representative in Congress even though

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17 the person is not registered. Each person in federal service may vote by absentee ballot or, upon

submitting an affidavit that the person is qualified to vote in the election, may vote at the person'spolling place.

3. Any interstate former resident[, as defined in section 115.275,] may vote by absentee
ballot for presidential and vice presidential electors.

4. Any intrastate new resident[, as defined in section 115.275,] may vote by absentee ballot at the election for presidential and vice presidential electors, United States senator, representative in Congress, statewide elected officials and statewide questions, propositions and amendments from such resident's new jurisdiction of residence after registering to vote in such resident's new jurisdiction of residence.

5. Any new resident[, as defined in section 115.275,] may vote by absentee ballot for presidential and vice presidential electors after registering to vote in such resident's new jurisdiction of residence.

115.279. 1. Application for an absentee ballot may be made by the applicant in person,
or by mail, or for the applicant, in person, by his or her guardian or a relative within the second
degree by consanguinity or affinity. The election authority shall accept applications by facsimile
transmission within the limits of its telecommunications capacity.

5 2. Each application shall be made to the election authority of the jurisdiction in which 6 the person is or would be registered. Each application shall be in writing and shall state the applicant's name, address at which he or she is or would be registered, [his or her reason for 7 8 voting an absentee ballot,] whether the voter is incapacitated or confined due to illness or 9 physical disability or is a person who is primarily responsible for the physical care of a 10 person who is incapacitated or confined due to illness or disability, the address to which the ballot is to be mailed, if mailing is requested, and for absent uniformed services and overseas 11 applicants, the applicant's email address if electronic transmission is requested. Each application 12 13 to vote in a primary election shall also state which ballot the applicant wishes to receive. If any application fails to designate a ballot, the election authority shall, within three working days after 14 15 receiving the application, notify the applicant by mail that it will be unable to deliver an absentee 16 ballot until the applicant designates which political party ballot he or she wishes to receive. If 17 the applicant does not respond to the request for political party designation, the election authority 18 is authorized to provide the voter with that part of the ballot for which no political party 19 designation is required.

3. [Except as provided in subsection 3 of section 115.281,] All applications for absentee ballots received prior to the sixth Tuesday before an election shall be stored at the office of the election authority until such time as the applications are processed in accordance with section 115.281. No application for an absentee ballot received in the office of the election authority by

mail, by facsimile transmission or by a guardian or relative after 5:00 p.m. on the Wednesday immediately prior to the election shall be accepted by any election authority. No application for an absentee ballot submitted by the applicant in person after 5:00 p.m. on the day before the election shall be accepted by any election authority, except as provided in subsections 6, 8 and 9 of this section.

29 4. Each application for an absentee ballot shall be signed by the applicant or, if the 30 application is made by a guardian or relative pursuant to this section, the application shall be 31 signed by the guardian or relative, who shall note on the application his or her relationship to the 32 applicant. If an applicant, guardian or relative is blind, unable to read or write the English 33 language or physically incapable of signing the application, he or she shall sign by mark, 34 witnessed by the signature of an election official or person of his or her own choosing. Any 35 person who knowingly makes, delivers or mails a fraudulent absentee ballot application shall be 36 guilty of a class one election offense.

5. (1) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any resident of the state of Missouri who resides outside the boundaries of the United States or who is on active duty with the Armed Forces of the United States or members of their immediate family living with them may request an absentee ballot for both the primary and subsequent general election with one application.

41 (2) The election authority shall provide each absent uniformed services voter and each 42 overseas voter who submits a voter registration application or an absentee ballot request, if the 43 election authority rejects the application or request, with the reasons for the rejection.

44 (3) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, if a standard oath regarding material
45 misstatements of fact is adopted for uniformed and overseas voters pursuant to the Help America
46 Vote Act of 2002, the election authority shall accept such oath for voter registration, absentee
47 ballot, or other election-related materials.

48 (4) Not later than sixty days after the date of each regularly scheduled general election 49 for federal office, each election authority which administered the election shall submit to the 50 secretary of state in a format prescribed by the secretary a report on the combined number of 51 absentee ballots transmitted to, and returned by, absent uniformed services voters and overseas 52 voters for the election. The secretary shall submit to the Election Assistance Commission a 53 combined report of such information not later than ninety days after the date of each regularly 54 scheduled general election for federal office and in a standardized format developed by the 55 commission pursuant to the Help America Vote Act of 2002. The secretary shall make the report 56 available to the general public.

57 (5) As used in this section, the terms "absent uniformed services voter" and "overseas 58 voter" shall have the meaning prescribed in [42 U.S.C. 1973ff-6] **52. U.S.C. Section 20310, as** 59 **amended**.

60 6. An application for an absentee ballot by a new resident[, as defined in section 61 115.275,] shall be submitted in person by the applicant in the office of the election authority in 62 the election jurisdiction in which such applicant resides. The application shall be received by 63 the election authority no later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election. Such application shall 64 be in the form of an affidavit, executed in duplicate in the presence of the election authority or 65 any authorized officer of the election authority, and in substantially the following form:

7. The election authority in whose office an application is filed pursuant to subsection 6 of this section shall immediately send a duplicate of such application to the appropriate official 8 of the state in which the new resident applicant last resided and shall file the original of such application in its office.

8. An application for an absentee ballot by an intrastate new resident[, as defined in section 115.275,] shall be made in person by the applicant in the office of the election authority in the election jurisdiction in which such applicant resides. The application shall be received by the election authority no later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election. Such application shall be in the form of an affidavit, executed in duplicate in the presence of the election authority or an authorized officer of the election authority, and in substantially the following form:

An application for an absentee ballot by an interstate former resident[, as defined in 117 section 115.275,] shall be received in the office of the election authority where the applicant was 118 formerly registered by 5:00 p.m. on the Wednesday immediately prior to the election, unless the 119 application is made in person by the applicant in the office of the election authority, in which 120 case such application shall be made no later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election. 115.283. 1. Each ballot envelope shall bear a statement on which the voter shall state 2 the voter's name, the voter's voting address, and the voter's mailing address [and the voter's reason for voting an absentee ballot]. On the form, the voter shall also state under penalties of 3 perjury that the voter is qualified to vote in the election, that the voter has not previously voted 4 5 and will not vote again in the election, that the voter has personally marked the voter's ballot in secret or supervised the marking of the voter's ballot if the voter is unable to mark it, that the 6 7 ballot has been placed in the ballot envelope and sealed by the voter or under the voter's

8 supervision if the voter is unable to seal it, and that all information contained in the statement 9 is true. In addition, any person providing assistance to the absentee voter shall include a 10 statement on the envelope identifying the person providing assistance under penalties of perjury.

9. A notary public who charges more than the maximum fee specified or who charges
or collects a fee for notarizing the signature on any absentee ballot or absentee voter registration
is guilty of official misconduct.

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
