## AN ACT

To amend chapter 170, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to establishment of a career and technical education certificate.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 170, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 170.029, to read as follows:

170.029. 1. The state board of education, in consultation with the

2 career and technical education advisory council as established in 3 section 178.550, shall establish minimum graduation requirements for

4 a career and technical education (CTE) high school

5 certificate. Students entering high school in the 2016-17 school year

and thereafter shall be eligible to earn a CTE certificate. A CTE

certificate shall be a high school graduation certificate that confers the

8 same benefits for students that are conferred by any other high school

certificate meeting graduation requirements established by the state

10 board of education.

- 2. A CTE certificate shall be based on requirements designed to provide students with technical skills and core academic skills and shall demonstrate that the student is ready for a career in a technical
- 14 field.
- 3. Curriculum, programs of study, and course offerings shall be
- 6 determined by the local school district based on the needs and interests
- 17 of the students in the district. The state board of education shall work
- 18 in cooperation with individual school districts with the goal of students

having access to a minimum offering of six vocational areas of study.

20 An effort shall be made by the local district to offer programs of study

21 relating to as many vocational career paths as economically feasible to

students in the district. In establishing curriculum requirements, the

23district may incorporate standards for industry-recognized

certifications. 24

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4. The department of elementary and secondary education shall promulgate all necessary rules and regulations for the administration of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 30 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2015, shall be invalid and void.
