- Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and
- Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2
- Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous articles, further 3
- providing for definitions and for Straw Purchase Prevention 4
- Education Program; and, in sentencing, providing for 5
- sentencing enhancement for sale or possession of unserialized 6
- firearm by certain persons. 7
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Section 6183 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania 10
- 11 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a definition to read:
- 12 § 6183. Definitions.
- 13 The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
- 14 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 15 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- * * * 16
- 17 "Unserialized firearm." A weapon which is designed to or may
- 18 readily be converted to expel any projectile by the action of an
- 19 explosive or the frame or receiver of the weapon that is
- 20 manufactured or otherwise assembled by an individual who is not
- licensed to manufacture firearms under this chapter. The term 21

- 1 does not include an antique firearm as defined in section
- 2 6118(c) (relating to antique firearms).
- 3 Section 2. Section 6184 of Title 18 is amended to read:
- 4 § 6184. Straw Purchase Prevention Education Program.
- 5 (a) Establishment. -- The Straw Purchase Prevention Education
- 6 Program is established and shall provide resources and direct
- 7 grant money to underwrite the cost of implementing an
- 8 educational and public service outreach program in the
- 9 community, which shall include information on purchasing
- 10 unserialized firearms.
- 11 (b) Outreach. -- The educational and public service outreach
- 12 program shall [inform]:
- 13 <u>(1) Inform</u> individuals of the illegal nature of
- 14 purchasing a firearm for an individual prohibited from owning
- 15 firearms.
- 16 (2) Inform individuals under what circumstances an
- 17 unserialized firearm may be manufactured, possessed, sold or
- 18 purchased.
- 19 (b.1) Program. -- The outreach program shall be developed by a
- 20 not-for-profit organization which:
- 21 (1) Is a national trade association representing the
- 22 shooting, hunting and firearm industry.
- 23 (2) Has a membership consisting of firearm
- 24 manufacturers, firearm distributors, firearm retailers,
- publishers and sportsmen's organizations.
- 26 (3) Has been in existence for at least 45 years prior to
- 27 the effective date of this section.
- 28 (c) Priority of grants.--Grants shall be prioritized based
- 29 on the highest incidence of firearm violence in a county of this
- 30 Commonwealth.

- 2 § 9712.2. Sentencing enhancement for sale or possession of
- 3 <u>unserialized firearm by certain persons.</u>
- 4 (a) Sentence enhancement. -- The Pennsylvania Commission on
- 5 <u>Sentencing</u>, in accordance with section 2154 (relating to
- 6 <u>adoption of guidelines for sentencing</u>), shall provide for a
- 7 <u>sentence enhancement within its quidelines for:</u>
- 8 (1) A person convicted of an offense under 18 Pa.C.S. §
- 9 <u>6105(a)(1) (relating to persons not to possess, use,</u>
- 10 manufacture, control, sell or transfer firearms) who
- 11 <u>possesses an unserialized firearm.</u>
- 12 (2) A person convicted of any other offense under 18
- Pa.C.S. (relating to crimes and offenses) while in possession
- of an unserialized firearm.
- 15 (3) A person convicted of an offense under 18 Pa.C.S. §
- 16 <u>6111 (relating to sale or transfer of firearms) for the sale</u>
- 17 of a firearm which is an unserialized firearm.
- 18 (b) Definition. -- As used in this section, the term
- 19 "unserialized firearm" shall have the same meaning given to it
- 20 in 18 Pa.C.S. § 6183 (relating to definitions).
- 21 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
