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             (i) "Firearm" means as defined by W.S.
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   6-8-403(a)(iii);
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             (ii) "Motor vehicle" means as defined by W.S.

    available for temporary or long term parking or storage of
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   motor vehicles which is available to employees, customers
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  and invitees;

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1 2 (C) Is a volunteer, intern or other similar individual. 3 4 5 (v) "Employer" means any business that is a sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation, limited liability 6 company, professional association, cooperative, joint 7 8 venture, trust, firm, institution, entity or association 9 that has employees; 10 11 (vi) "This act" means W.S. 27-15-101 through 12 27-15-104. 13 14 27-15-103. Protection of certain activities; 15 firearms. 16 (a) An employer may not establish, maintain or 17 enforce any policy or rule that has the effect of 18 19 prohibiting any employee from transporting or storing a 20 firearm in a motor vehicle on any property designated for 21 motor vehicle parking, if:

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1 (i) The individual is legally permitted to 2 transport, possess, purchase, receive, transfer or store 3 the firearm; 4 5 (ii) The firearm is locked securely in the motor vehicle or is in a locked container attached to the motor 6 vehicle while the motor vehicle is not occupied; and 7 8 9 (iii) The firearm is not in plain view from the 10 outside of the motor vehicle. 11 12 (b) An employer has no duty of care related to the acts or omissions required by this act. 13 14 (c) An employer that complies with this act is not 15 16 liable in any criminal or civil action for damages resulting from or arising out of an occurrence involving 17 18 the transportation or storage of a firearm in a motor 19 vehicle on property designated for motor vehicle parking. 20 This immunity does not apply to acts or omissions, 21 unrelated to compliance with this act, constituting gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct. 22

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(d) Nothing in this act shall be construed to expand 1 2 any existing duty, or create any additional duty, on the 3 part of an employer or that employer's agent. 4 27-15-104. Exemptions. 5 6 7 (a) The provisions of this act allowing secured 8 firearms in motor vehicles do not apply to: 9 (i) School premises, including any school 10 11 building or school grounds in this state and other 12 properties owned or leased by a school; 13 14 (ii) Government entities, including a local 15 authority or state entity; 16 17 (iii) Religious organizations, including 18 religious organizations acting as an employer. 19 20 (b) Nothing in this act affects restrictions on the 21 carrying of concealed weapons as provided in W.S. 22 6-8-104(t). 23

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(c) This act does not apply to any other property
 owned or leased by an employer upon which possession of a
 firearm is prohibited under federal law.
 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2015.
