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The legislature finds that federal funding and 5 the resulting capacity for responsible management of 6 federal public lands are in serious jeopardy while critical 7 8 threats such as beetle kills, invasive species, watershed 9 degradation, access restrictions and catastrophic wildfires

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12 The legislature further finds that the enabling 13 act creating the state of Wyoming includes specific 14 provisions for the disposal of public lands and guarantees 15 admittance into the union on equal footing with all other 16 states. Wyoming, like other western states, has not received the full benefit of the provisions of the enabling 17 act, related to the disposal of lands from the federal 18 19 government. More specifically, section 7 of the act of 20 admission requires "Five percent of the proceeds of the 21 sales of public lands lying within said state shall be paid to the said state for the support of the common 22 schools within said state." 23

12	public lands received under subsection (a) of this section,
13	the state shall:

15	(i) Retain five percent (5%) of the net proceeds
16	the state receives from the transfer of title; and

18	(ii) Transfer ninety-five percent (95%) of the
19	net proceeds the state receives from the transfer of title
20	to the United States.

22	(c) In accordance with the Wyoming state
23	constitution, the amount the state retains in accordance

with paragraph (b)(i) of this section shall be deposited 1 2 into the permanent common school account within the 3 permanent land fund. 4 Section 2. 5 6 (a) There is created a joint select committee on the 7 8 transfer of public lands, with members as follows: 9 10 (i) The speaker of the house of representatives 11 shall appoint two (2) members from each of the two (2) 12 largest caucuses of the house of representatives; and 13 14 (ii) The president of the senate shall appoint two (2) members from each of the two (2) largest caucuses 15 16 of the senate. 17 (b) The committee shall choose its chair or cochairs 18 19 from among its membership.

21 (c) The committee shall, with guidance from other 22 interested parties and stakeholders, prepare proposed 23 legislation:

4 (f) The joint select committee on the transfer of

5 public lands shall:

7 (i) Make preliminary reports on the study and

8 preparation of proposed legislation required under this

9 section to the legislature by June 30, 2016 and by October

10 31, 2016; and

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12 (ii) Deliver a final report containing findings,

13 recommendations and proposed legislation to the legislature

14 not later than January 2, 2017.

16 (g) The select committee shall be staffed by the

17 legislative service office. The office of state lands and

18 investments and the attorney general shall serve in an

19 advisory capacity to the task force and shall provide

20 technical and other relevant information as requested.

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22 (h) Members of the joint select committee on the

23 transfer of public lands shall be paid salary, per diem and

1 mileage as provided in W.S. 28-5-101 for their official

2 duties as members of the select committee.

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4 **Section 3.** There is appropriated twenty-five thousand

5 dollars (\$25,000.00) from the general fund to the

6 legislative service office. This appropriation shall be for

7 the period beginning with the effective date of this act

8 and ending June 30, 2017. This appropriation shall only be

9 expended for payment of salary, per diem and mileage for

10 legislative select committee members.

11

12 **Section 4.** This act is effective immediately upon

13 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

14 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

15 Constitution.
