Enhanced oil recovery commission amendments.

## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to enhanced oil and gas recovery; amending
- 2 the formal name of the enhanced oil recovery commission;
- 3 specifying the school at the University of Wyoming that
- 4 will conduct commission related tasks; clarifying and
- 5 amending the scope of the commission's authority and
- 6 obligations; amending definitions; and providing for an
- 7 effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 Section 1. W.S. 30-8-101(a), (b) (intro), (i), (ii),
- 12 (d)(i), (iii), (iv), (f)(i) and (ii) is amended to read:

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- 14 30-8-101. Enhanced oil recovery commission created;
- 15 duties.

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2 The Wyoming enhanced and improved oil recovery 3 commission is created. The commission shall consist of 4 eight (8) members. The governor and the state geologist shall serve as ex officio members of the commission. One 5 (1) legislative member shall be appointed by the management 6 council of the legislature who shall serve as an ex officio 7 8 member of the commission. The governor shall appoint the 9 remaining members of whom one (1) shall be from the public 10 at large with experience in the oil and gas industry, one 11 (1) shall be a member of the oil and gas conservation 12 commission, two (2) shall represent the oil and 13 industry and one (1) shall be a representative of the 14 University of Wyoming. The gubernatorial appointments shall 15 be confirmed by the senate. Appointed members shall serve 16 three (3) year terms. Members of the commission shall not 17 receive any fees, salary or other compensation for services 18 rendered but are entitled to receive per diem and mileage 19 on the same basis and at the same rate as state employees 20 and reimbursement for any other actual and necessary 21 expenses incurred in the performance of commission duties. The governor may remove any appointed member as provided in 22 23 W.S. 9-1-202. Except for the legislative member, initial

1 appointments or any vacancy occurring between sessions of

2 the legislature may be filled by the governor in accordance

3 with W.S. 28-12-101(b). The commission shall be staffed by

4 executive branch agencies as designated by the governor.

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6 (b) The commission, in conjunction with the

7 University of Wyoming school of energy resources and oil

8 and gas industry research entities, shall develop:

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10 (i) A research program at the institute for 11 energy research and enhanced oil and gas recovery at the 12 University of Wyoming school of energy resources. The program shall focus on oil and gas recovery technological 13 14 issues, including carbon dioxide separation, reservoir 15 sweep performance and reservoir displacement efficiency and 16 facilitate a meaningful and measurable increase in recoverable reserves and production of oil and natural gas 17 18 in Wyoming through the effective and efficient transfer of 19 relevant technology, information and knowledge to entities,

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22 (ii) An expanded A program at the institute

regardless of size, producing Wyoming reserves;

23 focusing on technology transfer, to help industry with

1	access to and application of existing enhanced oil and gas			
2	recovery and improved oil <u>and gas</u> recovery technology. The			
3	program shall be designed to promote research and			
4	technology transfer efforts, including polymer and			
5	surfactant flooding, horizontal drilling, zone specific			
6	fracturing and three dimensional seismic infill drilling;			
7	in both conventional and unconventional oil and gas			
8	reservoirs.

10	(d) The commission:

12	(i) Shall <del>oversee and direct development of</del>			
13	provide guidance and oversight and coordinate with the			
14	University of Wyoming school of energy resources to			
15	<pre>efficiently carry out the programs developed pursuant to</pre>			
16	subsection (b) of this section;

18	(iii) Shall facilitate the development of formal			
19	agreements between the <u>institute</u> <u>University of Wyoming</u>			
20	<pre>school of energy resources and the oil and gas industry</pre>			
21	through which the industry is provided access to the			
22	institute's geologic and engineering reservoir modeling and			
23	reservoir characterization work school's expertise and work			

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product in exchange for providing access to data access and

    of new technologies developed at the institute—throughout
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    the oil and gas industry in this state;

         (f) As used in this section:
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              (i) "Commission" means the Wyoming enhanced and

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              (ii) "Enhanced oil and gas recovery" and
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    improved oil recovery" means all existing and potential
14
    technology to recover oil and gas beyond traditional
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    primary and secondary methods, + including technology to

    optimize development and recovery of oil and gas resources
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    in new fields.
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**Section 2.** W.S. 30-8-101(b)(iii), (iv) and (f)(iii)

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is repealed.
